As the Guelph Ringette Association hosts the silver anniversary of the Guelph Ringette Tournament this weekend, its players will look particularly sharp decked out in their snazzy new jerseys featuring a new logo.

The idea of a new logo floated around about a year and a half ago to replace the old logo (seen below right).

"We were looking for something bright and flashy," said Guelph Ringette Association president Dave Kelton.

A committee decided on the cat design (seen in photo above). A ringette ring sits atop the 'h' in 'Guelph.' Jerseys are navy, grey and gold.

While the local teams don't carry a uniform name - like, say Guelph Minor Hockey's 'Junior Storm' or the Guelph Girls Hockey Association's 'Thunder' - something of that nature may be decided upon down the road, said Kelton. He said some teams are going by cat names like IceCats and Lions. The new jerseys arrived before Christmas.

The 25th annual tourney features 80 teams and more than 1,000 players. It was to start this morning and it wraps up Sunday.

Games take place at Centennial, Victoria Road and the West End Recreation Centre rinks.

A special event at the tourney pits the top ladies teams in Ontario and Quebec squaring off at 2:30 p.m. Saturday at the West End Rec. Centre.
